

SYNTHETIC BOWLING GREEN RULES

The Wyong Leagues Group is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for its Workers, Members and Visitors.

All minors must be supervised by their parent or guardian at all times.

It is the Policy of this Club that the Bowling Greens and surrounds are smoke-free at all times. This includes the spectator areas, entries into the club within 4 metres, and alfresco dining areas, as well as other areas as nominated by the Club.

Smoking must only be carried out in the designated smoking areas of the venue. No drinks or glass are permitted onto the greens at any time. Responsible Service of Alcohol applies.

This area is only operational until dusk. Subject to change at management's discretion. Access is not permitted after dusk without management approval.

Take care at all times when stepping on and off the greens.

Footwear must always be worn (football, soccer boots, or similar footwear are not permitted).

Disabled access must comply with the applicable Bowls Australia Policy.

Access to grassed bowling greens is not permitted without authorisation.

This area is monitored under CCTV at all times.

All items, including but not limited to personal or gameplay equipment, must be stored correctly with no items being left on the green, footpaths, in walkways or blocking off areas or access. The Club will not be held liable for incidents of this nature.

Do not litter, please place rubbish in the bins provided.

All incidents must be reported immediately to the Club Supervisor on duty.

In an emergency situation, the Club Supervisor must be notified, and you must follow their directions.

Inappropriate behaviour and conduct will not be tolerated, and the Club may ask you to leave the premises. Further action may be taken.

The use of bats, sticks, and hard/heavy balls is not authorised. Rough gameplay or tackling will not be tolerated.

Patrons, parents or guardians will be held liable for any damage caused to the greens, property, or surroundings. The Club will not be held liable for damage or injuries.

During extreme weather conditions, it is the responsibility of the event coordinator, competition manager or controlling body to determine appropriate action. Please refer to the Bowls Australia Weather Policy.

Your actions must not put your or others' safety at risk. You must abide by these rules and other Registered Club rules.
